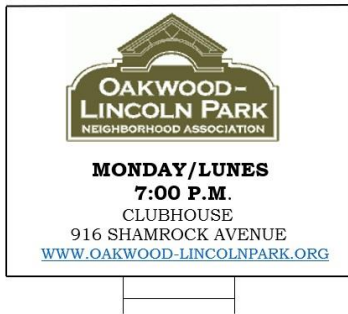

RECODE UPDATE: There are over 70,000 parcels of property in Knoxville. The city is undergoing an update to the zoning codes, the first comprehensive update in over 50 years. This update will streamline processes for redevelopment, but everyone needs to be informed. Recode passed the Knoxville-Knox County Planning (formerly MPC) and will be heading to Knoxville City Council this spring for approval. For more info about recode, visit: recodeknoxville.com.
